Dedication God of light, Lord of nations: You have shown Your glory to all humankind in Jesus Christ. And in Him we are drawn together. Use the gifts that we bring to You to further the work of Your church, that all people may know Your truth, love, and praise; through Jesus Christ the Lord of all. Amen.

Responsive Scripture (Adapted from 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; I Corinthians 15:51-58; and Revelation 22:17, 20, 21; *The Message*)

- Leader: And regarding the question, friends, that has come up about what happens to those already dead and buried, we don't want you in the dark any longer. First off, you must not carry on over them like people who have nothing to look forward to, as if the grave were the last word. Since Jesus died and broke loose from the grave, God will most certainly bring back to life those who died in Jesus.
- Choir: And then this, we tell you with complete confidence—we have the Master's word on it—that when the Master comes again to get us, those of us who are still alive will not get a jump on the dead and leave them behind. In actual fact, they'll be ahead of us.
- Leader: The Master himself will give the command. Archangel thunder! God's trumpet blast: He'll come down from heaven and the dead in Christ will rise they'll go first. Then the rest of us who are still alive at the time will be caught up with them into the clouds to meet the master.

All: O, we'll be walking on air! And then there will be one huge family reunion with the Master.

- Choir: So reassure one another with these words.
- Leader: Let me tell you something wonderful, a mystery I'll probably never fully understand. We're not all going to die but we are all going to be changed.
- Choir: You'll hear a blast to end all blasts from a trumpet, and in the time that you look up and blink your eyes it's over.
- Leader: On signal from the trumpet from heaven, the dead will be up and out of their graves, beyond the reach of death, never to die again.

All: At the same moment and in the same way, we'll all be changed.

- Choir: In the resurrection scheme of things, this has to happen: everything perishable taken off the shelves and replaced by the imperishable. This mortal replaced by the immortal.
- Leader: Then the saying will come true:

All: Death swallowed by triumphant Life! Who got the last word, oh, Death? Oh, Death, who's afraid of you now?

Leader: It was sin that made death so frightening and law-code guilt that gave sin its leverage, its destructive power. But now in a single victorious stroke of Life, all three--sin, guilt, death-are gone, the gift of our Master, Jesus Christ.

All: Thank God!

- Leader: With all this going for us, my dear, dear friends, stand your ground. And don't hold back. Throw yourselves into the work of the Master, confident that nothing you do for him is a waste of time or effort.
- Choir: "Come!" say the Spirit and the Bride.

Leader: Whoever hears, echo, "Come!"

All: Is anyone thirsty? "Come!" All who will, come, and drink, Drink freely of the Water of Life!

Leader: He who testifies to all these things says it again: "I'm on my way: I'll be there soon!"

- All: Yes! Come, Lord Jesus!
- Leader: The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all of you.
- All: Oh, Yes! Amen!
