### When you arrive:

Go directly to the auditorium lobby to **register and pay** (checks are preferred). You **must** register before you go to a cabin or room, or set up your campsite. You will be assigned lodging on a first-come, first-served basis.

If you wish to reserve a cabin, or if you have limited mobility or a disability, please contact Bob Tebo (989-865-9965) in advance for a room that will meet your needs.

## Accommodations:

Dormitory-style rooms or cabins. Bring your own bedding and towels.

Personal recreational vehicle or tent sites. Electrical hookups and public bathroom facilities are provided for those sites.

Covered wagons may be available for rustic camping with a water pump, a picnic table and an out-house on-site. If you choose this option, bring sleeping bags and warm clothing; it can be cold at night.

A daily camp fee of \$9/person is assessed for Fri & Sun to those staying just for the day. No additional charge to those camping in covered wagons.

### Activities:

- Canoe down the river or ride the pontoon on the lake
- Swimming in the lake (a lifeguard will be present)
- Hiking and horseback riding
- Softball, basketball, volleyball, or horseshoes
- Strolling around the boardwalk
- Go-cart racing
- The Observatory may also be open at times
