WHAT IS THIS CONTROVERSY?

Let's get a working definition: "the Great Controversy refers to the cosmic battle between God and Satan over the moral right of God to rule, which is not a question of divine power but focuses on charges against God's character of goodness, justice, and love ..."

1. Adventist misunderstanding 2. Thomistic Classical Theism = no Great Controversy 3. Liberalism (post-enlightenment)

TO THINK ABOUT

"It is impossible to explain the origin of sin so as to give a reason for its existence. Yet enough may be understood concerning both the origin and the final disposition of sin to make fully manifest the justice and benevolence of God in all His dealings with evil. Nothing is more plainly taught in Scripture than that God was in no wise responsible for the entrance of sin; that there was no arbitrary withdrawal of divine grace, no deficiency in the divine government, that gave occasion for the uprising of rebellion. Sin is an intruder, for whose presence no reason can be given. It is mysterious, unaccountable; to excuse it is to defend it."
